Allergic Reaction


I chose to react to a sculpture that was a Māori sculpture of a waka/canoe by Te Ara Minhinnick. I chose this artwork because it is my favourite artwork in the Scape Festival.

It depicts a waka buried under the ground in Christchurch by the river Avon.

I responded with my own photographic artwork (inspired by Ai Weiwei) to express how I felt about normal artists who are always in the limelight while the work of disabled artists is hidden underground like the waka.

Disabled artwork needs to be unearthed.
